SDB has a long history of providing scientific leadership by organizing high impact conferences. We are proud to say that our meeting is currently considered the major annual conference in the field, attracting participants from around the world.

I would like to invite you to participate in this meeting as a sponsor and/or an exhibitor. There are several options for your contribution: unrestricted support for the meeting, travel support for students, postdoctoral fellows and teaching faculty, support for a particular session chosen from the program that most closely relates to your Company's interests, tutorial session, or meeting tote bag. Please make your choice in the enclosed Sponsorship Form and return to us at your earliest convenience, especially if you want to secure the session of your choice.

Detailed descriptions of some of these opportunities are as follows:

### **Travel Awards**

For student and postdoctoral members who are the first authors presenting a poster or a talk at the meeting, and have limited resources to travel to the meeting. This incentive, although usually modest (\$200 - \$500 per person), has been very helpful to bring more students to the meeting. We feel very strongly about encouraging young minds to enter the ever more difficult and competitive field of basic research. Currently the requests are above our support ability and any additional funds will increase the number and the level of individual assistance.



### **Teaching Faculty Travel Grants**

For faculty at primarily teaching institutions or departments to present their or their students' work. Teaching faculty play a very important role in introducing students into the exciting field of developmental biology and the SDB Board of Directors decided in 2004 to add this new initiative to facilitate their participation at our annual meetings. This group has a large representation in our membership but has fewer resources for travel to meetings.

### **Latin American and Caribbean Scholarships**

This is a merit-based scholarship and it aims to bring our colleagues, junior faculty, postdoctoral fellows and students from Latin America and the Caribbean to our annual meetings. SDB initiated this program in 2000 and has been able to support a total of six scholars (three students and three faculty members) per year, at \$2,000 per person. In part as a result of this continuing collaboration with our colleagues in this hemisphere, we have organized three very successful short courses on developmental biology with the Latin American SDB which were funded by the National Science Foundation/Department of Energy's Pan American Advanced Studies Institute Program and by the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development/NIH in 2005, 2008 and 2010. A fourth one is being planned for April 2012 in Montevideo, Uruguay. This is a strong indication that our efforts are worthwhile and your support will help enhance the program. Each scholarship you support will carry your company's name and you will be notified once selection of the scholars is made. We also think this is an excellent relation-building opportunity for companies that have or want to establish representation in the Latin American/Caribbean regions.



### Best Student Posters Competition

Support for prizes to winners of the **Best Student Posters Competition**. The prize for the first place winner is to present their work at the British Society for Developmental Biology's spring meeting, as part of a long-standing exchange program with our British counterpart. SDB covers the travel expenses of our poster winner to the UK and the hosting expenses of the British winner to our meeting. You may contribute to the first or other winning prizes. SDB gives one year online subscription of our official journal *Developmental Biology* to each of the three top winners. Additional books and publications are usually donated by publishers to all finalists and honorable mentions.

### Best SDB Regional Meeting Presentation Travel Awards

In 2005, the SDB Board of Directors introduced a new award category: the **Best SDB Regional Meeting Presentation Travel Awards**, where a travel award of up to \$1,000 is given to the author of the best student and the best postdoctoral presentations at each SDB regional meeting to showcase their winning paper at the annual meeting. The following regions will hold their meeting in 2011: Northeast, Mid-Atlantic, Southeast, Northwest, and West Coast; the dates and sites are now posted on our website. You may choose to sponsor one particular region or give general support.

### Postdoctoral Symposium

This session was introduced in the 2006 annual meeting and it is run by postdoctoral fellows who select talks from abstracts submitted by their cohorts. We currently do not have funds to specifically assist the chosen speakers, who have to compete with others in the general pool of travel awards. Your designated funds can focus on these meritorious young speakers.

### Tutorial Sessions

These are exclusive educational/research sessions aimed at your company's new products of particular interest to our membership. You would invite scientists to present their research findings using these products (equipment, reagents, or specific methods), or to organize a round table discussion about the merits and pitfalls of the technology. Past participants find this a very good chance to vent their experience with the technologies and obtain assistance from the company's experts in a dedicated setting. The company representatives also find the feedback from end-users very helpful for improving their products. Meeting room and AV will be provided with this contribution.

Since these are tax-exempt donations for educational purposes, we will not provide services or products in return, but we will send you all the meeting materials distributed to participants. Public recognition of your support at the meeting and a link to your company's website via your logo posted on our meeting website will be provided. In addition, we offer exhibit opportunities at the dedicated poster sessions, where active discussions and networking take place.
